

"Elohim" Names of God Series November 25, 2018

"And those who know your name put their trust in you."

Psalm 9:10

- 1. Elohim refers to God as our <u>CREATOR</u>. Genesis 1:1
 - a. The word "el" is a general reference to a GOD.
 - b. The suffix "him" is <u>PLURAL</u> indicating three or more. Deuteronomy 6:4
- 2. Elohim reveals the **SURPREME** nature of God.
 - a. God is the <u>UNCREATED</u> Creator. Isaiah 57:15, Psalm 90:2
 - b. God is <u>GOD</u> of all gods.1 Chronicles 16:25, Deuteronomy 10:17, 1 Samuel 17:46
- 3. Elohim reveals God's <u>CREATIVE</u> attribute. Genesis 1, Hebrews 11:3
 - a. God creates to bring Him <u>GLORY.</u> Leviticus 10:3, Isaiah, 42:8, Psalm 72:19
 - b. God creates to reflect His <u>MAJESTY</u>. Psalm 19:1-4, Romans 1:20

- 4. Elohim reveals God's <u>RELATIONAL</u> desire. Genesis 3:8. James 2:22
 - a. God created us to <u>LOVE</u> Him. Genesis 1:26
 - b. God created us with a <u>PERSONAL</u> touch. Jeremiah 1:5, Genesis 2:7, Psalm 139:13-14

Questions to Consider:

- Do I recognize *Elohim* as the supreme Creator-God of the universe? Is *Elohim* supreme in my life?
- Do I see this created world through the lens of God's glory and majesty?
- Have I entered into a personal relationship with *Elohim* through Jesus His Son?
- Am I living for my created purpose and appointment by *Elohim*? Or am I living to something else?

What is the Holy Spirit prompting me to do?
