

"A Christmas Paradox" Matthew 2:1-12 December 22, 2019

"But you, Bethlehem... are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for out of you will come a ruler who will shepherd my people..." Matthew 2:6

What does this passage teach us concerning the newborn baby Jesus?

- 1. Jesus came to RULE over us.
 - a. We must submit <u>PERSONALLY</u> to the reign of Jesus. Philippians 2:9-11, Romans 6:23
 - b. We must allow Jesus to rule with <u>ABSOLUTE</u> Kingship. Mark 12:30
 - c. We must prepare for Jesus to rule <u>GLOBALLY</u>. Revelation 15:3-4, Haggai 2:7
- 2. Jesus came to <u>SHEPHERD</u> us. John 10:11, Psalm 23:1-6
 - a. He wants us to cast our <u>CARES</u> on Him. Psalm 23:1-3, 55:22
 - b. He wants us to find our <u>COMFORT</u> in Him. Psalm 23:4, 46:1, 1 Peter 5:8, Acts 20:29
 - c. He wants us to walk <u>COMPETENTLY</u> with Him. Psalm 23:5-6, 1 Corinthians 15:57, James 4:8, Jeremiah 29:13, John 14:2, 2 Corinthians 4:17

Questions to Consider:

- This Christmas season, have I submitted entirely to Jesus as Ruler of my life?
- If Jesus is the Ruler of my life, what area do I need the Shepherd to tend to in my life? Provision? Comfort? Victory? Something else?

What is the Holy Spirit prompting me to do?
